**BROOKE ULRICKSON RECEIVES TEXAS YOUNG
LAWYERS ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT'S AWARD OF
MERIT**

Brooke Ulrickson, an attorney with Brown, Dean, Wiseman, Proctor, Hart & Howell L.L.P., received the President's Award of Merit from the Texas Young Lawyers Association ("TYLA") on Friday, June 26, 2009 at the TYLA Annual Meeting.

Ms. Ulrickson was recognized by the TYLA President, Sylvia Cardona, for her outstanding work in coordinating and launching Ten Minute Mentor Goes to Law School, a series of short, instructional videos designed to assist law students in preparing for and succeeding in law school. The segments were launched in February 2009 and are currently being promoted to all Texas law students. In addition, Ms. Ulrickson was recognized for the many articles she contributed to the TYLA E-news including an ethical article, "How Will You Be Remembered" which challenged lawyers to think about their everyday actions and the legacy they will leave behind.

TYLA, originally organized in 1930, is a department of the State Bar of Texas. All licensed Texas Lawyers who are 36 years old or younger or who are in their first five years of licensure, regardless of age, are automatically members of TYLA. The Association is commonly referred to as the "public service arm" of the State Bar. TYLA's main purposes are to facilitate the administration of justice, foster respect for the law, and advance the role of the legal profession in serving the public. TYLA's programs are designed to assist Texas attorneys in their practice of law and to provide public legal education services to Texans.
